

At Leilani Farm Sanctuary, we often care for tiny chicks who are brought to us without a mother, or who can't keep up with their mothers due to injury. When chicks are young they need to be kept warm and protected from predators. Fortunately, we discovered, much to our surprise, that our blind rooster loves to care for these little chicks, and competently takes on the role of mother hen. Each night, he spreads his wings and keeps the peeps warm. In the daytime, the chicks run around the enclosure and groom him. ***It is the perfect loving, symbiotic relationship.***
